Bentleigh West Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our Parent Payments Policy and voluntary financial contributions for 2023.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

Please be assured Bentleigh West Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents. We are continually striving to achieve the best for all the children and these contributions, which are approved by School Council, will allow us to provide extra programs and equipment.

Bentleigh West Primary School understands that some families may sometimes experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) provided by DET and is automatically paid to the school for families holding a valid means-tested concession card. If eligible primary school students receive \$125 per year. Applications are made via the school and payments commence from March 2023 onwards. More information and application forms will be sent out at the beginning of 2023.
- State Schools Relief to assist with clothing and uniforms.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
